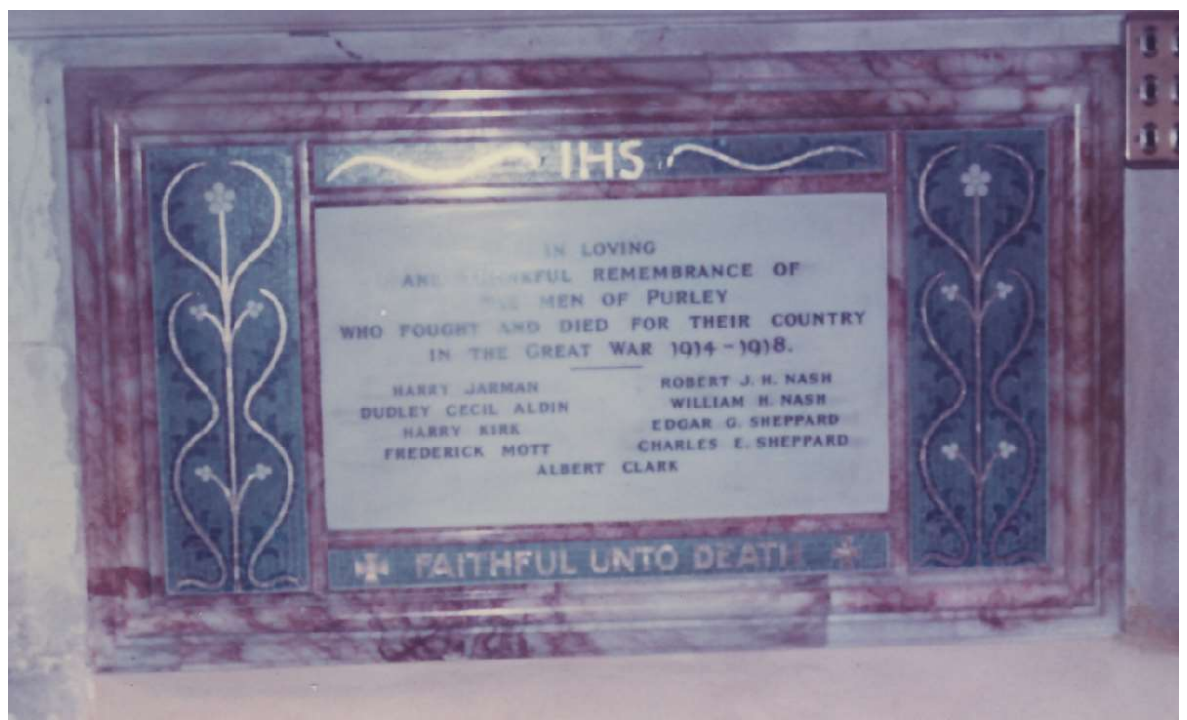

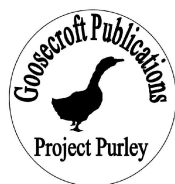

Introduction to the series

This series of six booklets lists the memorials of the Parish of Purley on Thames in Berkshire. The vast majority are to be found at St Mary's Church but there are many more both in the Parish Council cemetery at Goosecroft and scattered around the parish. Each inscription is given a number and for the first two parts this corresponds with the grave number. The remaining memorials are numbered in groups according to the part of the series as follows:-

Part 1 - Inscriptions on headstones in the old churchyard (MIs 1-179)

Part 2 - Inscriptions on headstones in the new churchyard (MIs 180-399)

Part 3 - The memorials inside and outside the church (MIs 400-499)

Part 4 - The cremations memorials in the churchyard (MIs 500-599)

Part 5 - Inscriptions on headstones and cremation stones in the Goosecroft Burial Ground (MIs 600-799)

Part 6 - Other inscriptions and memorials around the parish (MIs 900-999) plus an overall index

The Attached Memorials

The inscriptions listed in this part are to be found mostly attached to the inside walls of St Mary's Church, but a few are attached to furniture or to objects in the graveyard. There are also a number of inscriptions from memorials which have now disappeared.

For inscriptions which did not survive the rebuilding of 1870, credit is due to Elias Ashmole who visited the church in 1661 and to Mrs Becker who visited shortly before the rebuilding.

The inscriptions were checked by John Chapman in 1983 shortly before the construction of the extension.

No attempt is made to reproduce the lineation of the original text or the typography. Surnames are generally rendered in capitals and all notes and added information in italics.

The Inscriptions

401 IWARDBY

Inscription

Iana filia et haeres Iohannes IWARDBY Equis Aurati Domini hujis Mannery de Purley castissima Iohannis SAINT IOHN Coniux Pientissima demum vidua vesata Eiusq duo ex Nicholao SAINT IOHN nepote pronepotes Michael et Ricardus sub beatae resurrectionis spe hic requiescunt Sacrum hoc memoriae pie posuit Iohannis SAINT IOHN Miles et Baronettus dictae Ianne quartiis Haeres

Translation

Jane, daughter and heir of Sir John IWARDBY knight, Lord of this manor of Purley, the most chaste and pious wife and at length the veiled widow of John ST. JOHN Also two of her first cousins, Michael and Richard, sons of Nicholas ST. JOHN rest here in hope of a blessed resurrection. To her sacred memory Sir John ST. JOHN, knight and baronet, fourth heir of the said Jane, has piously placed this.

Location

An incised slate tablet on south wall of tower. originally on a monument on the south wall of the chancel (Ashmole 1664) The present tablet appears to be only part of the original memorial.

Notes

By the time of her death she had remarried Nicholas SAUNDERS of Farley, Hants and Ewell, Surrey

402 HYDE (1632)

Inscription

Here lyes the body of Ann the wife of Edward HYDE of ye Middle Temple London Esqr & daughter of Sr George AYLIFFE of Grittenham in the County of Wilts knt who dyed on the 2d day of Iuly in ye yeare 1632 aged 20

Vale anima candidissima vale mariti tui quem dolore et luctu conficis aeternum desiderium vale faeminorum decus et saeculi ornamentum.

Translation

(as given by Elias Ashmole)

Farewell thou soul most fair, Farewell thou eternal desire of thy husband whom thou killest with sorrow and grief, Farewell of woman the glory and the age's ornament

Location

On south wall inside tower. Recorded by Ashmole as 'on the south side of the east window' and 'above the inscription are the arms of Hyde and Ayliffe. Underneath is the decumbant portraiture of a woman resting on a death's head having the figure of a

child in swaddling clothes lying before her bosom'

Notes

Edward HYDE later became Earl of Clarendon and his daughter by his second wife (also Ann) became Queen to King James II. See also MI 452

403 NOBLE (1644)

Inscription

Here lyeth Will NOBLE sonne of Thos NOBLE of Rearsbye in ye County of Leycester. Preacher of ye word of God, lae parson of Brocksbye & Vicar of Quenneburrough in ye said county. Who died y 6th of Oct Ao 1644.

Inscription on reverse

Here lieth Agnes NORTON late wife to George NORTON Esq who departed the vth of Iune 1601 in the XXXVIIIth yeare of her age. Who had issue by the saide George tenn sonnes & six daughters where of were living at the time of her decease 4 sonnes and 4 daughters.

Location

Presently not mounted. Formerly located in stonework at the base of the 14th century window in old vestry. Mrs Becker recorded it pre 1870 as 'N side of chancel on a brass plate fixed on a gravestone'. Elias Ashmole recorded it in a similar position in 1664

Notes

The wording recorded by Ashmole in 1664 is quite different from that extant in 1983. William Noble was the son-in-law of Richard Watts - see MI 404

404 WATTS (1659)

Inscription

Here lyeth the body of Richard WATTS late Rector of Purly in the County of Berks, Master of Arts in Trinity Coledge in Cambridge. He died the ***** anno Domini, 16** Aged 78 Yeares.

Location

No longer extant. Recorded by Ashmole in 1664 and by Mrs Becker pre 1870 as 'Upon a gravestone at the entrance into the chancel'

Notes

Richard Watts was rector of Purley from 1623 until 1659. His daughter married William Noble - see MI 403

405 HIDE (1711)

Inscription

Here lyeth the body of Francis HIDE Esq who departed this life January ye 13th 1711/12 in ye 55th year of his age.

Location

No longer extant. Recorded in Additions to Ashmole as 'A marble gravestone in the church', alongside MI 452

406 BLAGRAVE(1740)

Inscription

Here lyeth Thomas BLAGRAVE Esq. Late justice of peace for the county of Berks, eldest son of Mr Geo BLAGRAVE of Tilehurst, son of Tho BLAGRAVE formerly rector of this parish. Descended from the antient family of DUCKETTS in Wiltshire. He died the 7th April 1740 age 63

Location

No longer extant. Recorded in Additions to Ashmole as ' A marble gravestone in the body of the church'

Notes

Thomas's grandfather, also Thomas, was rector of Purley from 1670 to 1684. see also MI 407

407 BLAGRAVE (1754)

Inscription

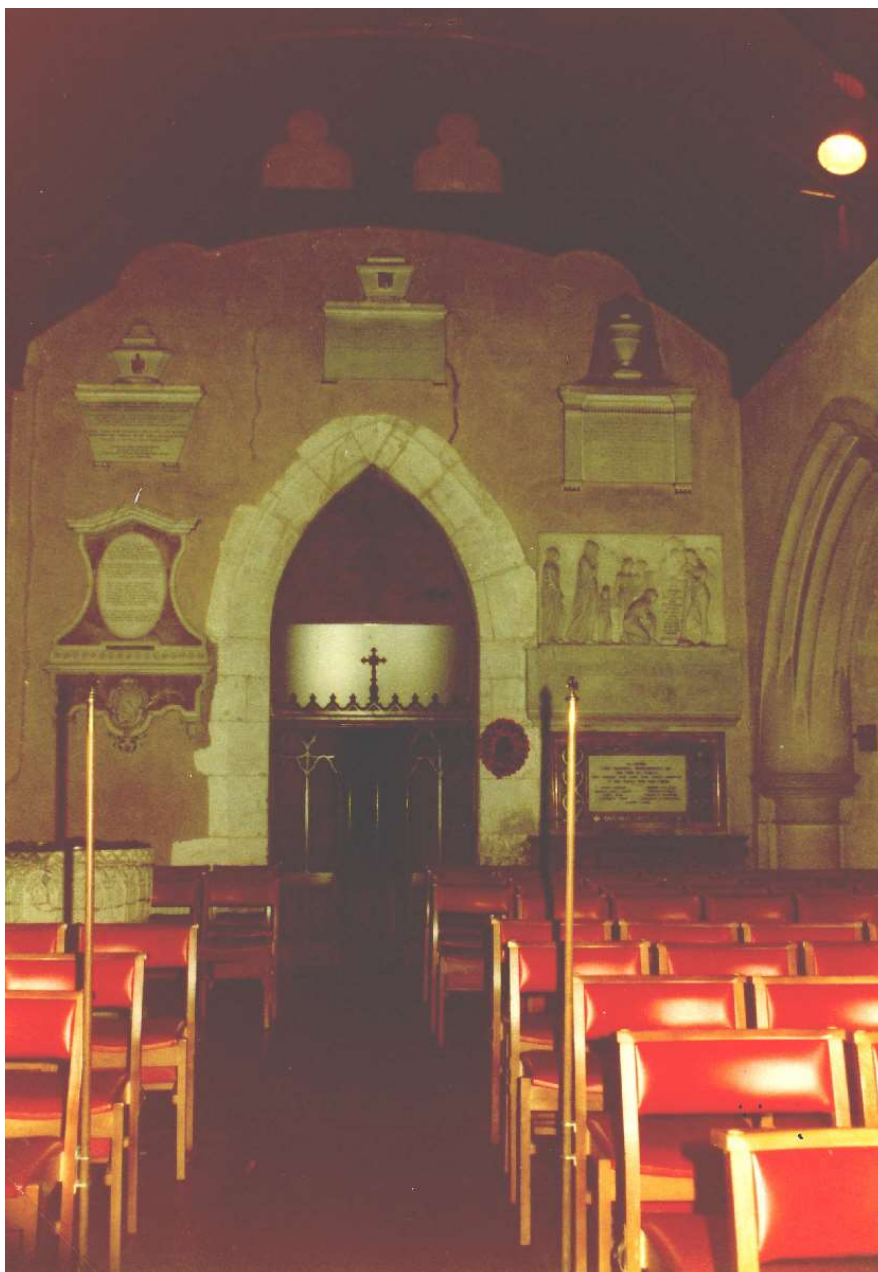
Near this place was also buried the above named George BLAGRAVE 1709 and Mary his wife. George buried June 1st 1709 aged 57, Mary buried August 6th 1717 age 53
Here also lyeth the body of Ann widow and relict of the above named Thos. BLAGRAVE esq who was eldest daughter of Anthony BARKER esq formerly of Sunning in this county. She died the 4th of June 1754 age 76 years

Location

No longer extant. Recorded in Additions to Ashmole as ' A marble gravestone in the body of the church'

408 HAWES (1756)

Inscription

Here lies the body of Thomas HAWES esq who was for many years one of his Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the County of Berkshire, Cashier of his Majesty's navy, Secretary to his Majesty's Commissioners of Appeals, Treasurer to the Russia Company and one of the Registers of the Diocese of Norwich. In all which stations and employment he acquitted himself with honour and integrity.

He dy'd the 2th day of April 1756 aged 76 years to the great affliction of his only and beloved brother Francis HAWES Esqr of Purley Hall in the County of Berkshire who erected this monument to perpetuate the memory of a truly good Christian and an honest man.

*"Peace to thy dust, thou best of brothers and the truest friend! "
Thy soul is higher fled where mine shall be.
In realms of hope a soujourner with thee.
Till Christ's last trumpet summons us to bliss,
in future worlds united as in this.*

Location

A richly carved coloured marble tablet ornamented with pillars on the north wall inside tower.

409 LIEBENROOD (1772)

Inscription

In this vault are deposited the remains of Ann late the wife of John George LIEBENROOD of this parish Esq. who died August 25th 1772 aged 47 years.

With the noble virtues that elevate nature she possessed the softer talents that adorn it, being pious, humble, charitable, candid and sincere she fulfilled the duties of humanity and her heart was truly Christian.

After a long and painful illness she died calm and resigned to the dispensations of Heaven leaving her disconsolate husband and friends to deplore their loss and cherish the dear remembrance of that worth they honoured living and lament in death.

To the memory of the best of wives the best of friends, he for whom she had the most tender affection dedicates this monument.

Location

Recorded in Additions to Ashmole as "In the west end on the wall". Now on the west wall of nave adjoining MI 413

410 ALLEN (1757)

Inscription

Here lieth the body of John ALLEN Gent of this parish who departed this life Feb 22d 1757 in the 74th year of his age

And also here lieth the body of John ALLEN his son who departed this life 21st Dec 1746 in the 20th year of his age

And here also lyeth the body of Mrs Anne ALLEN wife of the above John ALLEN Gent who departed this life September the - 1775 aged 77 years.

Location

No longer extant. Recorded in Additions to Ashmole as 'A marble gravestone in the body of the church

411 GLEICKMAN (1777)

Inscription

Under this stone is deposited the body of Theodore George GLEICKMAN Esqr, late merchant at Rotterdam, nephew to John George LIEBENROOD Esq of this parish. Who died at Purley the 8th of July 1777 aged 33

Location

Not extant 1983. Recorded by Mrs Baker pre 1870 and in Additions to Ashmole as 'A marble gravestone in the body of the church'

412 CHAMBERS (1780)

Inscription

In memory of the Reverend Charles Chambers MA who departed this life July 5th 1780 aged 32 years

Location

No longer extant. Recorded in Additions to Ashmole as 'A marble gravestone in the body of the church'

Notes

He was the father of Elizabeth Sparrow - see MI 420

413 WORLIDGE (1772)

Inscription

In the vault beneath near the remains of his beloved wife who died the 24th day of December AD 1772 aged 54 years is deposited the mortal part of Philip WORLIDGE of Battersea in the County of Surry Esquire who departed this life the first day of April AD 1783 in the 71st Year of his age.

His virtue which attracted esteem and admiration while on earth are now beyond the reach of worldly applause and possess their reward in the presence of the Almighty.

This monument is erected not with the vain attempt to bestow praise on the undeserving nor with the useless endeavour to add to the fame of a worthy and amiable man, but to express the gratitude, affection and the sorrow of a surviving friend.

Location

North wall inside tower. Recorded in Additions to Ashmole as adjoining MIs 416 and 418

414 HALL (1798)

Inscription

Anna HALL daughter of the Revd Charles Henry HALL d August 4th 1798 aged 3 years.

Of such is the kingdom of heaven

Location

North wall inside tower. Originally on the south wall in the body of the church.

Notes

Anna was not recorded as having been buried at Purley. The Reverend Charles Henry Hall was Bampton Lecturer at Oxford at the time of his daughter's death. Later he became Regius Professor of Divinity at Oxford University (1807-1809) and Dean of Christchurch (1809-1824) see Dictionary of National Biography.

415 STORER (1793)

Inscription

In memoriam Dilectissimi Patris Thomae STORER Qui ob Juli 25 1793 aet suae 76. Hoc marmor nec superbum nec aliquid habens ornatus praeter ipsum ejus nomen posuit. Pientissimus filius A.M.S

Translation

In memory of a revered father Thomas STORER who died 25th July 1793 in the 76th year of his age.

This marble cannot honour him more than does his own fame

By his most pious son Anthony Morris Storer

Location

On north wall of old vestry, on the left hand wall as you ascend the stairs to the mezzanine.

Notes

See also MI 417

416 LIEBENROOD (1795)

Inscription

Within this vault lie the remains of John George LIEBENROOD Esquire. A native of Ellrich in the County of Hohenstein in Saxony who died the 5 Jan: 1795. Aged 83 years.

By his early & constant endeavours to fulfil the duties of a man and a christian he obtained the blessing of God. His liberal contributions to public charities; his benefactions to the poor here & abroad and particularly to his numerous relations will

ever be remembered with warmest gratitude and affection. But by none more than his adopted great nephew John Engelberts LIEBENROOD, formerly ZIEGENBEIN.

Location

Recorded in Additions to Ashmole as 'on south side towards west end'. Now on S wall of tower.

417 STORER (1799)

Inscription

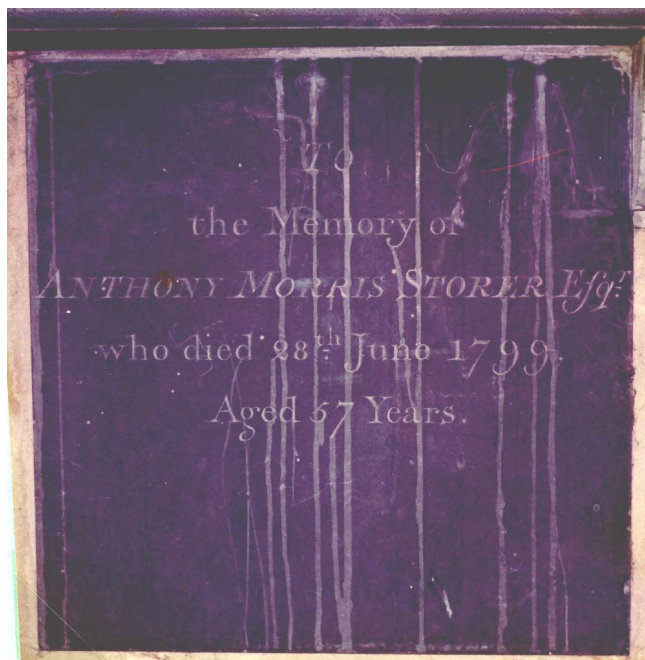
To the memory of Anthony Morris STORER Esq who died 28th June 1799
Aged 57 years

Location

On South wall of mezanine above old vestry. An incised slate tablet.

Notes

AMS was the son of Thomas Storer (see MI 415) and uncle of Anthony Gilbert Storer (see MI 421) to whom he bequeathed Purley Park. See also MI 428



418 SOUTHBY (1807)

Inscription

Sacred to the memory of Richard SOUTHBY Esq. Who died April the 6th 1807.
Aged 55 years

Location

E wall of tower (upper left) Oval tablet (755mm x 553mm) on rectangular base (921mm x 762 mm), Recorded in Additions to Ashmole as 'On south side towards west end' and adjoining MI 413

Notes

Richard was the husband of Ann Southby - see MI 419 He is buried in plot 111

419 SOUTHBY (1816)

Inscription

Sacred to the memory of Ann the wife of Richard SOUTHBY esq who died Oct. 13th

1816 aged 49 years.

Location

E wall of tower (upper right). Oval tablet (755mm x 553mm) on rectangular base (921mm x 762 mm)

Notes

Ann Sherwood was baptised at Purley on 11th October 1767. She was the brother of Richard Sherwood - see MI 426 - and married Richard Southby - see MI 418

420 SPARROW (1819)

Inscription

Sacred to the memory of Elizabeth, the wife of John SPARROW Esq. Youngest daughter of the late Revd. Charles Chambers MA obit June 5th 1819 aetatis 42 years. A tender and most affectionate wife, a sincere and anxious friend.

Possessing a superior mind she thro' many years illness borne with unsurpassing patience and resignation the greatest severity of suffering and the very great humility of her conduct evinced an entire hope of her enjoying eternal bliss.

Location

West wall of nave. Recorded pre 1870 as On the south wall of the nave.

Notes

Elizabeth Sparrow of London buried 12 June 1819 at Purley. John Sparrow of Brighton buried 4 November 1858 at Purley aged 80. See also MI 412.

421 STORER (1818)

Inscription

A G STORER Esq. obit June 15th 1818. Ann Katherine his wife obit May 7th 1854 aetat 69. Sincerely regretted by all her friends.

Sacred to the memory of Anthony Gilbert STORER esq of Purley Park in the County of Berks and of Belleisle and Frome in Jamaica by his widow Ann K STORER who has likewise caused this monument to be placed here in affectionate remembrance of his many amiable and excellent qualities.

*What tho in distant climes thy body lies,
Thou'rt here embalmed in all our memories;
Thy widow, children, friends the loss deplore,
Which fell on all when Storer was no more:
Prized for that justice, intrest could not bend,
That firmness freedom ever gives her friend.*

*Whateer alloy thy gen'rous nature knew,
 Like dross that makes gold hard and current too,
 Served but to fit thee for this coil of earth.
 And into human sink superior worth.*

Location

On west wall of Nave.

Notes

See also MI 417 for his uncle.. Pevsner attributed the poem to Flaxman.

422 LIEBENROOD (1829)

Inscription

In the vault beneath are deposited the remains of John Engelberts LIEBENROOD Esqr of Prospect Hill who died 23rd day September 1823 Aged 67 years.

Encouraged by the hope of a blessed immortality he occupied the talents entrusted to him. To the glory of his heavenly master in the habitual exercise of Christian benevolence.

Here also the remains of Lucy his widow who died in Christ 16th April 1829 aged 67

Await a joyful resurrection.

Also of John ZIEGENBEIN son of the above who died 17th day of February 1803 aged 10 months.

Location

West wall of nave. A trapezoidal marble tablet with black letters incised. Two feet and surmounted by funeral urn in marble bearing coat of arms.

423 MANESTY (1844)

Inscription

Sacred to the memory of the Revd Charles MANESTY who departed this life on the 10th day of November 1844 aged 71. Forty Four years rector of this parish

Location

North wall of chancel.

Notes

Buried in plot 68, Charles was rector of Purley from 1800 to 1844.

424 POWLEY (1904)

Inscription

In memoriam. The Rev Matthew POWLEY Canon of Gibraltar, 20 years rector of this parish 1884-1904. Died August 24th 1904.

Location

Brass plate on south wall of chancel.

Notes

Matthew is buried in plot 131. His son Alan was killed in the First World War see MIs 433 and 434.

425 WILLOUGHBY (1866)

Inscription

This window dedicated to the glory of God and in memory of her beloved sister Agnes WILLOUGHBY by Cicely B STORER. Born Sept 28th 1833, died March 9 1866

Location

Incorporated into glasswork at bottom of east window of church

426 SHERWOOD (1863)

Inscription

To the glory of God and in memory of Richard SHERWOOD Esq a native of this parish who died at Speen July 31st 1863 aged 80 years. These three windows are erected by his widow 1869.

The three lancet windows are entitled as follows :

East SANCTUS LUCAS

Centre VADE ET TU FAC SIMLISER

West SANCTE IOANNES

Location

Brass plate affixed to south wall of chancel below the three lancet windows

Notes

Richard Sherwood was a surgeon. He was baptised at Purley 8th May 1783 and married Elizabeth Stephens at Aldermaston 19th March 1807. He was the brother of Ann Southby (See MI 419) Richard and Elizabeth are buried in plot 95. See also MI 451

427 SHERWOOD (1900)

Inscription

In loving memory of Edith Sophia SHERWOOD of the China Inland Mission daughter of Edward SHERWOOD late of this parish. Born at Pangbourne April 11 1854 killed at Kiu-Chau Chekiang July 24 1900

He preserveth the souls of his saints Ps XCVII.16

Whosoever shall lose his life for my sake and the gospels the same shall save it Mark VIII.35

Location

It was located before 1983 on the north wall of the north aisle. A brass plate on a marble tablet now located on the south wall of the chancel

Notes

Edith Sherwood was the daughter of Edward and Amelia Sherwood and was baptised at Purley 27th April 1854. She was killed in the Boxer Rising. Edward and Amelia are buried in plot 112.

428 STORER (1799)

Inscription

HSF Antonius Morris Storer

Vir temporis multo elegantissimus Et centum amator artium in plurimis facile princeps. A secretis comitis de Carlisle American visit legationis a secretis ad Regem Christianissimum missus est. Domus senator huius natus inter, animi Fundatoris In Collegium Henrici sexti id omne quod ahi amico genio. Haeredi largius est obit anno aetatis suae LIV

Hoc marmor testamenti curatores Feciunda justerunt Inscrisit Stephanus.

Translation

A man of his time, of great refinement and a lover of many of the Arts, and a master of many of them. A valued confidant of Carlisle on his American visit and legate to the Most Christian King.

He was motivated by the same spirit as the founders of the College of Henry VI and his own life carried on the traditions.

He died in the 54th year of his age

This marble is a testament to his works.

Inscribed by Stephen

Location

West wall of Nave. Recorded in Additions to Ashmole as 'being on the south side of the east window'

Notes

See also MI 417 The reference to the Most Christian King refers to the King of France at whose court he was ambassador for a short while.. The College of Henry VI is Eton College at which Storer was a pupil. The Monument is by Nollekins

429 MATTHEWS (1914)

Inscription

In thankful memory of John Henry Dudley MATTHEWS Assistant master at Wellington College 1868-1884, Headmaster of Leeds Grammar School 1884-1902 and rector of this parish 1902-1914.

He lost his life on the night of December 20th. 1914 while crossing the river from Mapledurham where he had preached at Evensong on the text *'The souls of the righteous are in the hands of God'*

Location

South wall of chancel

Notes

John is buried in plot 129.

430 BOYLE

Inscription

To the Glory of God and in loving memory of Captain the Honb. R.F BOYLE R.N. and Elizabeth his wife of Purley Lodge

Location

Incorporated in glasswork at bottom of Good Samaritan window in S wall of nave.

431 HAWES (1761)

Inscription

In memory of Francis HAWES of Purley Hall Esq who died Sepr ye 15th 1761 aged 85 years.

And Elizabeth HAWES daughter of the above named Francis Hawes who died Febry ye 28th 1776 aged 31 years

Location

On the south wall of the tower.. Mrs Becker recorded this pre 1870 as ' on S wall on inlaid marble tablet'

432 ALDIN (1919)

Inscription

To the glory of God and in memory of our dearly loved and only son Dudley Cecil ALDIN 2nd Lieut Royal Engineers (105th Field Coy) Killed in action in France during night operations on Vimy Ridge May 15th 1916 aged 19 years

Greater love hath no man than this that he lay down his life for his friends.

If thou should'st call me to resign What most I prize it ne'er was mine I only yield thee what is Thine.'

Location

South wall of nave. Incised and enamelled brass plate.

Notes

See also MI 434. Son of Cecil Aldin (see MI 439)

Buried at Ecoivres Military Cemetary, Mont St Eloy, France in Plot 1, Row L, Grave 2. His gravestone bears the following inscription beneath the badge of the Royal Engineers:-

Second Lieutenant D C ALDIN ROYAL ENGINEERS 15th May 1916

'I thank my God upon every remembrance of you' Phil 1,3

433 POWLEY (1916)

Inscription

In loving memory of Alan D POWLEY 2nd Lieut 1st King's African Rifles. Youngest son of the late Revd M POWLEY for 20 years Rector of this parish. Who gave his life for his King and Country on June 10th 1916 while leading his men in a charge against the enemy in German East Africa.

Location

Brass plate on south wall of chancel

Notes

Buried at Iringa Military Cemetary, East Africa. Plot 3, Row A, Grave 5. Aged 35

434 WORLD WAR ONE

Inscription

IHS

In loving and thankful remembrance of the men of Purley who fought and died for their country in the Great War 1914-1918

Harry JARMAN, Dudley Cecil ALDIN, Harry KIRK, Frederick MOTT, Robert J H NASH, William H NASH, Edgar G SHEPPARD, Charles E SHEPPARD, Albert CLARK.

Faithful unto death

Location

West wall of nave. A brown marble tablet with mosaic pattern surrounded in gold, turquoise and royal blue. The money for this memorial was raised by public subscription in the parish.

Notes

***H Jarman** - see also inscription on mother's grave (plot 86). Died of wounds 29th August 1915 aged 20. Commemorated on Helles Memorial, Gallipoli Turkey MR4 Panels 18 & 19 . He worked at SPP on the Oxford Road in*

Reading and is also commemorated on their war memorial now in Reading Museum.

D Aldin - see MI 432

F Mott - Buried Bancroft Military Cemetery, France Plot 3 Row M, Grave 14.

His grave bears the inscription:-

9390 Private F C MOTT, Royal Berkshire Regiment, 28th October 1916 aged 23.

Wait patiently for him from Mother, Dad, Sisters and Brothers

C Sheppard - Killed in action 7th October 1917 aged 35. Commemorated on Tyne Cot Memorial, Passchendale, Belgium Panels 38-40.

E Sheppard - Killed in action 5th November 1917. Commemorated on Tyne Cot Memorial, Passchendale, Belgium. Panel 151.

H Kirk - Lost at sea during Battle of Jutland after his ship, HMS Black Prince, blew up on 31st May 1916. Aged 21 Commemorated on Naval Memorial, Portsmouth (MR3) Panel 18

R Nash - died as prisoner of the Turks 25th September 1916 aged 23. He had served with the Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire Light Infantry and was part of the contingent that had capitulated at Kut 29th April 1916. Buried in Baghdad, North Gate War Cemetery, Iraq in Plot 21, Row 10, grave 13. See 'The History of the 43rd and 52nd Regiments in the Great War', Vol 1 by J E H Neville, (1935)

W Nash - Killed in action 1st July 1916. Commemorated on Thiepval Memorial, France Pier 11 and Face D

435 FULLERTON (1919)

Inscription

The clock in this tower was erected to the memory of G F Downing FULLERTON and his wife Leila Minna Gertrude of Purley Park, Berkshire by their four children April 1919

Location

Incised into wooded plaque on south wall of tower. The clock mechanism is on the second stage of the tower and the clock face on the outside South wall. The mechanism was made by Gillett and Johnson Ltd of Croydon Surrey.

Notes

Leila and George are buried in plot 154

436 FULLERTON (1930)

Inscription

In grateful remembrance of Janet Mary FULLERTON Born 18th May 1895, the wife of Richard Alexis Downing FULLERTON.

Died at Ware, Lyme Regis 16th February 1930 and laid to rest at Purley.

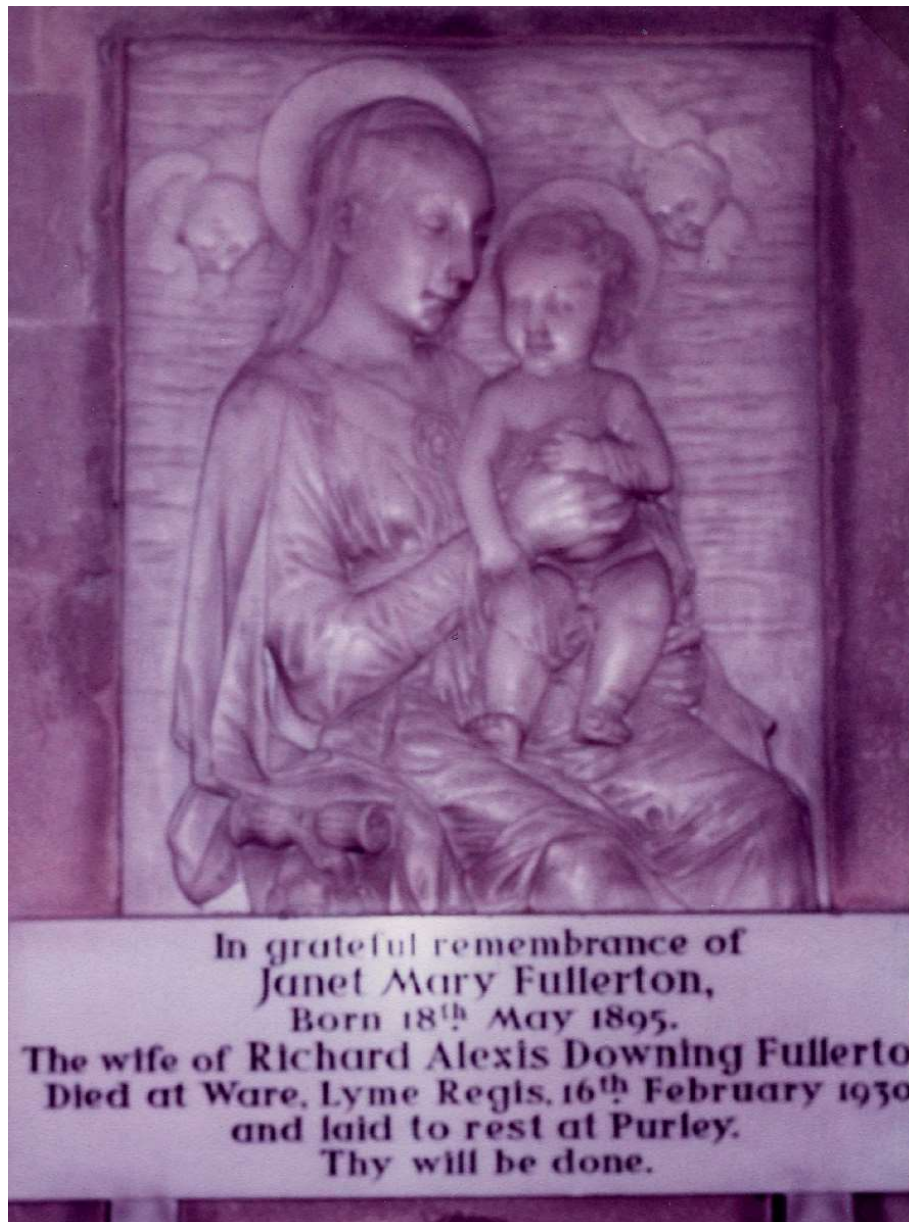
Thy will be done

Location

Alabaster carving of the virgin Mary holding the infant Jesus in her lap. Heads of winged cherubims at the top corners. Mounted on marble tablet on the south wall of the nave. The carving is believed to be Italian.

Notes
