Project Purley Publications

This small publication is a reproduction of the National Telephone Company's Directory for Berkshire issued in May 1894.

Telephone services had come to Great Britain in 1879 with two companies: The Edison Telephone Company of London and The Telephone Company Ltd (Bells Patents) each using a slightly different patent but in 1880 they merged to become the United Telephone Company using the Bell patent which had been granted to Emile Berliner in June 1877 and assigned to the American Bell Telephone Company.

The National Telephone Company was formed 10th May 1881 after the High Court had ruled that the telephone was '*A telegraphic communication and that any company providing telephone services would require a licence from the Post Office to do so*'

Berkshire had been served by The South of England Telephone Company which had 3255 customers and became the Southern Province in 1890 as NTC gradually took over all the other regional companies.

It met with many obstructions from local authorities and the Post Office who regarded its activities with the greatest suspicion. The restrictions were the root cause of the many complaints about poor service, noise and high prices which were swamping NTC by 1892, for example they were not allowed to bury their cables. Eventually when the 1881 licence expired on 31st December 1911 the Post Office exercised its right to take over and NTC passed into liquidation.

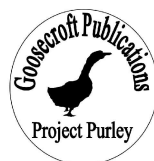

Subscribers are requested to notify in writing any mistake in their Names, Addresses, or Exchange Numbers, and it is most particularly desired that gratuities be not, under any circumstances, offered to the servants of the Company.

EXCHANGE SYSTEM.

Each Subscriber is furnished with a special wire and instrument connected to a Numbered Indicator at the nearest Exchange. The operator identifies Subscribers by their numbers only. The Company are opening Exchanges at Marlow, Slough, Windsor, Eton and Staines. Full particulars can be obtained on application to the District Office.

SERVICE.

The Company's Exchanges, except in some few exceptions of outlying centres, are kept continuously open day and night, including Sundays.

FAULTS.

A "fault" or interruption of service should be reported at once to the Local Manager, in the town in which it arises, and, if possible, on the Company's form, or by written memorandum. No verbal complaint can be recognised.

EXTENSION LINES.

Separate Instruments in connection with an existing Exchange Line may be fitted in a Private Office at a small additional charge per year; such Instruments are usually used by the Principal or Manager on special matters which it is not desired shall be dealt with in the hearing of others. This, likewise, prevents the Principal being troubled with matters to which a Clerk in an outer office can attend.

TELEGRAMS.

Subscribers to the Company's Exchange System in

READING

can by arrangement transmit and receive their telegrams direct by telephone.

Full information in respect to this service can be obtained at any office of the Company.

TARIFF RATES.

Rates for Exchange service vary according to distance, and one of the Company's officials will on application call on any intending Subscribers, or on any firm that Subscribers would like to have communication with, and give full information.

INSPECTORS.

Subscribers are cautioned to refuse to allow strangers to inspect their telephones. The Company's representatives will always prove their identity when visiting for inspection of apparatus.

PAYMENTS.

Official Receipts are given only by the District Office and the Company's Official Receipt form only will be recognised. Payments should be made by Crossed Cheque to the order of the Company.

Subscribers are expressly cautioned against permitting the use of their Telephones by Non-Subscribers. Breach of this rule of the Company, which is necessitated by the conditions of the Company's license from the Postmaster-General involves cancellation of the agreement for the service.

TELEPHONIC COMMUNICATION BY TRUNK LINES WITH OTHER TOWNS.

The TRUNK LINES are for use in common by Subscribers and the Public, and Calls are subject to a limit of three minutes. No person can have the use of a Trunk Wire for more than two consecutive periods of three minutes if any one else is waiting for the use of the wire.

The Company have opened PUBLIC TELEPHONE CALL ROOMS in various Towns, where any person, whether a Subscriber or not to the Telephone "Exchange" System, can speak to any firm or person on the Exchange in any Town connected by Trunk Wires.

Nearly all the most important Towns are now telephonically connected.

The scale of payment for conversations on the Company's Trunk Lines, by Subscribers is as under :

In order to obtain the benefit of the above rates, Subscribers must produce a Trunk Pass, which can be obtained at the Company's District Office on payment of the necessary fee.

Non-Subscribers are charged double above rates.

It is a condition of this Service that Subscribers *forward the amount due to the Company's District Office within seven days of the account being rendered*, failing which, the Operators have instructions to refuse Calls until it is paid. No question as to the accuracy of the Account can be entertained after seven days from receipt of same.

PRIVATE WIRES, ETC.

The Company erect and maintain, at an annual rent, or erect and sell outright, Private Lines to any specification at low rates, and undertake all kinds of Electrical Work (except Lighting) and will supply estimates for Rental or Sale outright of new installations or maintenance of existing apparatus over land, under water, or in Collieries, Mines and Quarries.

LOCAL CALLS.

The Company have opened Telephone Call Rooms throughout the District for the use of subscribers and non-subscribers alike, at a charge of 1d. for local calls for three minutes' conversations, that is for calls other than those over trunk wires. Subscribers will not have the privilege of using these call rooms free of charge. A list of these call rooms appears on page 10.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE USE OF EXCHANGE LINES.

TO CALL A SUBSCRIBER.

I.—Turn the handle, then take the receiver off the hook, place it close to your ear and listen for reply. Tell the operator the number of the subscriber you wish to speak to, notice that the number is correctly repeated, and wait with the receiver to your ear until the subscriber asked for replies to the operator's call. When listening be careful to answer only to your own number.

TO ANSWER A CALL.

II.—Take the receiver off the hook, place it close to your ear and speak. It is of the greatest importance that the bell should be answered IMMEDIATELY it rings; neglect of this frequently causes delay throughout the whole system.

III.—Speak about six inches from the transmitter clearly and distinctly but not loudly.

TO GET DISCONNECTED.

- IV.—When you have finished speaking hang the receiver on the hook and turn the handle to intimate to the Exchange to disconnect you. After you have been connected do not again turn the handle unless you wish to be disconnected. The handle should never be turned unless you require attention from the Exchange.
- V.—Unless the receiver is on the hook the subscriber cannot call, or be called by the Exchange.
- VI.—When two subscribers are connected, and one of them leaves the instrument, his receiver should be hung on the hook, the other subscriber keeping his receiver to his ear and replying promptly should the operator ask if he has finished.
- VII.—Report all faults immediately they occur, by MEMORANDUM to the Manager, at the Company's local offices. Nothing else can be recognised.
- VIII.—Conversation with the switch room, other than asking for the numbers required, is not allowed. The operators are strictly forbidden to answer any question.
- IX.—Do not knock on the transmitter either with the receiver or your knuckles as it damages the instrument.

Subscribers are notified that their strict adherence to the above rules is absolutely essential, and that only by this can the efficient working of the system be attained.
